

Native Hawaiian Communities

•In 2008, Hawai`i's Child Welfare Services received over 4800 reports of child abuse and or neglectphysical, sexual, psychological

In 2007-2008, 51% of the children in the foster care system were of Native Hawaiian ancestry
2008-2009, Native Hawaiian children in foster care is at approximately 40%, still a high percentage.

•About 1400 of Hawaii's children are in foster care at any given time.

•150 foster children await permanent homes.








Significant Breakthroughs with Community Providers
