Once you've entered Amazon through a FPH or ITAO link, we receive a revenue share from all products you purchase during that visit. This includes books, computers, music and merchandise you purchase during that session.

## **How does this work?**

Family Programs Hawai‘i (FPH) has an agreement with Amazon.com that enables visitors to both the [familyprogramshawaii.org](http://familyprogramshawaii.org) and the [ittakesanohana.org](http://ittakesanohana.org) websites to purchase books, computers, music and other merchandise. This agreement allows purchases made through links from these sites to result in a portion of your total purchase being given to FPH, called a revenue share. These funds are used to support ITAO programs.

*We only receive this money if you shop through one of the links on one of the above websites. Once you've entered Amazon through a FPH or ITAO link, ITAO receives a revenue share from all products you purchase during that visit.*

The links provided on the [familyprogramshawaii.org](http://familyprogramshawaii.org) and [ittakesanohana.org](http://ittakesanohana.org) sites are specially coded to designate you as an ITAO supporter. This is the only way to ensure that your purchase goes to supporting the ITAO program.
