Defining Normal: Working Together to Improve Life for Young People in Foster Care — Presented by the HI H.O.P.E.S. Youth Leadership Board and Delia Ulima, Hawaii Youth Opportunities Initiative (HYOI) Statewide Initiative Coordinator. For young people who become a part of the foster care system, life is anything but normal. A new federal law sets out guidelines for child welfare agencies and courts to improve a young person's social capital and give resource caregivers more opportunities to act as a natural parent would in relation to everyday activities. This workshop will review the law, provide the youth voice and outline recommendations. Breakout groups will discuss various issues that affect a young person's well-being and normalcy while in foster care.
