The Family Treatment Services offers a continuum of care for women wanting help with their alcohol/drug addiction. We provide residential and outpatient substance use treatment that addresses the special needs of women including support for their children. As women move out of residential treatment, they are supported with housing that continues to help them in recovery by rebuilding relationships with children and loved ones and supporting educational/professional goals to lead to self-sufficiency.

### ELIGIBILITY

Our services and programs are for women who are willing to change and recover from their drug and/or alcohol addictions. Pregnant women will receive priority for services.
