- Major clinical criteria unchanged:
 - Qualifying Psychiatric Diagnosis and
 - Significant Functional Impairment
 - CAFAS > or = 80 for youth over 12
 - Expanded access: younger children CAFAS > or = 60 for youth under 12

- CAMHD Eligibility

Two main factors:
funding source and
clinical eligibility

- Funding source can be:
 - Medicaid – if youth is enrolled in any Quest plan
 - Youth who are eligible through their Special Education program (IEP)
 - OYS funding – if youth is involved in the JJ system – or at risk of involvement – through an MOA
 - Grant-funded programs: Kealahou and On-Track
